

We hope here at Oneblood that you've been able to stay safe during these trying times. With coronavirus disrupting our lives, it's hard to make sense of our new "normal".

Oneblood has been running drives at our structured accounts abiding to the CDC recommendation and guidelines of social distancing. In order to ensure that this happens we are scheduling appointments allowing only 4 donors on the mobile at one time. Care is taken in the cleaning of the mobile each time we have a donor from the beginning to end of the donation process. The safety of the donors is our utmost priority.

Social Distancing

- Encourage donors to make appointments across a 20 minute interval to decrease number of individuals present at one time. Donors will be asked to wait in their cars or outside abiding by the 6 foot requirement.
- All donors will have their temperature taken on arrival and will be asked to hand sanitize on arrival.
- Masks are required and will be supplied if you do not have one with you.
- Interested donors should arrive alone for the donation as someone who is not donating will not be allowed on the mobile.
- Blood drive set up for additional precautions for disinfecting.
 - Wearing masks
 - Changing gloves and sanitizing hands between donors
 - Wiping down beds after each use.
 - Frequently cleaning high-touch surfaces, tablet and pens.
- All registration stations will be set up within social distancing guidelines
- All donor stations will be set up within social distancing guidelines
- The refreshment station will be set up with social distancing guidelines.
